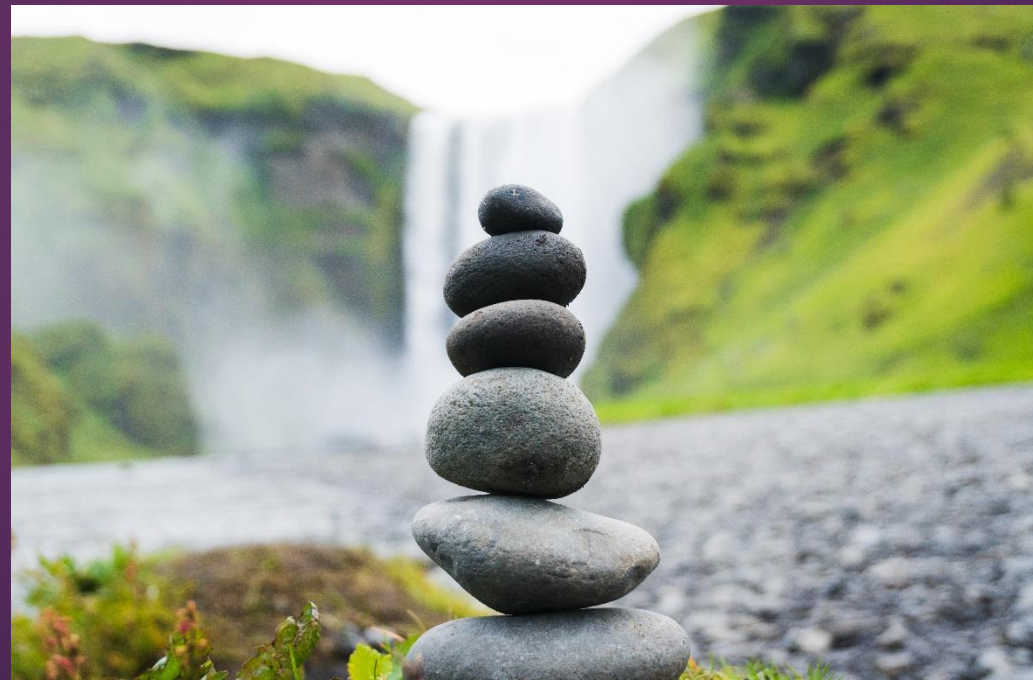


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L.E.V.E.L. U.P. Vision

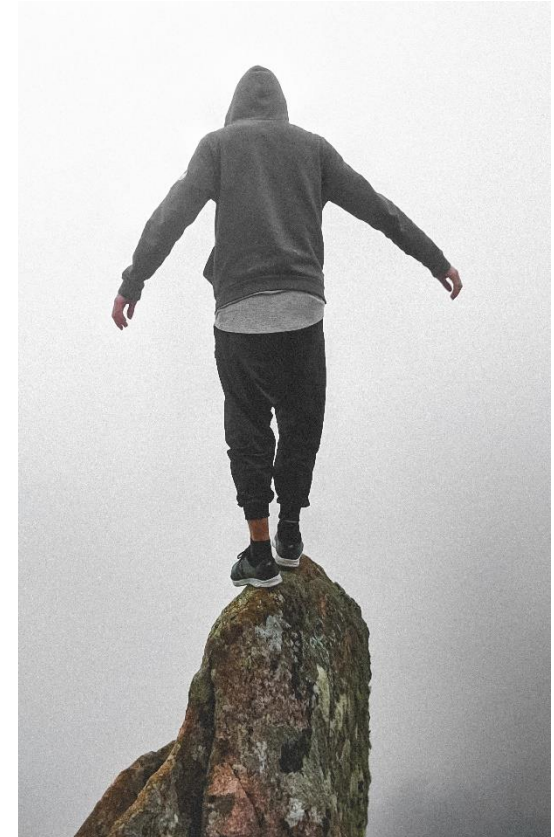


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L.E.V.E.L. U.P. Targets & Outline



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- ▶ Target audience:
 - ▶ 10th – 12th grade students and parents/guardians
 - ▶ Focused on education
- ▶ Talent Needed
 - ▶ Mentors (5) **(dependent upon participation)**
 - ▶ **(5 mentors with 3 mentees each for a total of 15 students)**
- ▶ Time commitment from students/parents/guardians
 - ▶ 2 Saturdays per year
 - ▶ **(Two on same day – morning and afternoon)**
 - ▶ 4 meetings with mentor, if possible

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Academic Year Program Schedule

▶ Fall

- ▶ Introductory virtual workshop to share information about the program and get individuals started with thinking about next steps
- ▶ 10th & 11th grade workshop – What is your plan? (virtual/in-person)
- ▶ 12th grade workshop – How are you getting there? (virtual/in-person)
- ▶ Workshops will be recorded to allow access after the session
- ▶ Completion of ‘Going to College’ worksheet
- ▶ Website development to host workshop recordings, resource tabs, and other information relevant to participant educational pursuits (resource page will be password protected to spark curiosity and encourage participation)

▶ Spring

- ▶ 10th – 11th grade workshop to discuss steps for college admission standards and application processes (virtual/in-person)
- ▶ Seniors - Completion of college application/acceptance lists
- ▶ Graduates and Mentors Recognition Ceremony – June/July
